WELCOME TO COLLEGE

R. P. Gogate College of Arts & Science and R. V. Jogalekar College of Commerce (Autonomous), Ratnagiri is situated on coastal area of the Konkan Region of the Maharashtra State. Our college is a leading college in Konkan region with competent staff, adequate infrastructure and motivated students. Our college offers various undergraduate, post graduate and PhD research programmes. The College also has an excellent Library, Boys and Girls Hostels on the College premises and a modern gymnasium for the students & the staff.

For the past glorious 80 years the College has been helping talented students from both rural and urban areas of Ratnagiri to make the most of their abilities. Situated in the heart of the Hamlet city of Ratnagiri, it is one of the oldest colleges in the entire konkan region. The College has changed quite dramatically over the decades in physical appearance, infrastructure, programmes and courses we teach and in the careers of the students. However one thing that has not changed is our vision and mission of helping students to be successful and fulfilling futures. There are around 3400 students studying from UG to PG and PhD programmes. Quite a sizable amount of students are accommodated in hostels both boys and girls in this campus. Imparting education, knowledge and providing student support is our primary focus. The college has an exceptionally rich sporting, cultural, research and social life.

We are fortunate to have our own sports ground, well equipped gymnasium, 65 classrooms, international standard badminton hall, two seminar rooms, well equipped pure and life sciences laboratories, three canteens, botanical garden, girls and boys common rooms and rich well-equipped open access digitized library.

The college has been accredited by NAAC Bangalore for the 4th Cycle with an 'A' grade and 3.22 CGPA. UGC New Delhi has awarded the special grant to enhance the overall competency of the college under the CPE scheme. The college has been approved for the scheme of PM-USHA Grant to strengthen Colleges by Government of Maharashtra. The Department of Science and Technology, Government of India has awarded FIST (O-level) grant for improvement in Science and Technology Infrastructure. The College has obtained autonomy in its operations and academic affairs from UGC. This status grants the college certain degree of independence in decision making process related to curriculum development, examination procedures, admission and administration among other areas. The

College implemented NEP 2020 for its first year UG & PG Courses from the academic year 2023-24. The combination of all these factors means college has a relaxed, friendly and open atmosphere with an activity engaged student body.

STUDENT CHARTER

Every stakeholder of higher education has a role to play for quality enhancement and sustenance. The stakeholders such as the Government, management, teachers, students and the external quality assurance agencies have an important role in ensuring quality of higher education. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) strives to play a catalytic role in synergising the stakeholders efforts.

Of all the stakeholders mentioned above, the students have a unique role to play in ensuring quality of higher education institutions (HEIs). Firstly, the students should realize that they have the right for quality education and it is the responsibility of the HEIs to provide quality educational experience to learners. Secondly, the students should equally be aware of their responsibilities which in turn will help the institutions to provide quality education. This means that the students should demand quality education and demonstrate their commitment to quality education by accepting their responsibilities. Otherwise the HEIs will have very little motivation for quality enhancement.

An initiation has been made by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in this direction by developing a sample student charter for all higher education institutions. It is hoped that the charter will help educational institutions to articulate their obligations to learners in clear terms and can be used as a benchmark for institution's accountability to learners. The NAAC advocates the public display of student charter in every institution as an act of promotion of student participation in Quality Assurance.

A) Institution's responsibilities towards students: -

The institution shall

1. communicate its goals and objectives systematically and clearly to all students
2. offer programmes that are consistent with its goals and objectives.
3. offer a wide range of programmes with adequate academic flexibility.
4. use feedback from students on the initiation, review and redesign of programmes if and when necessary.
5. facilitate effective running of the teaching-learning programmes.
6. implement a well-conceived plan for monitoring student progress continuously.
7. ensure that the student assessment mechanism is reliable and valid.
8. provide clear information to students about admission and completion requirements for all programmes, the fee structure and refund policies, financial aid and student support services.
9. ensure sufficient and well-run support services to all students.
10. promote values, social responsibilities and good citizenry in all students.

B) Students' Responsibilities of Learning: -

The student shall

1. appreciate the institutional goals and objectives and contribute to the realisation of the same by participating in relevant institutional activities.
2. have a clear knowledge of the programmes, admission policies, rules and regulations of the institution.
3. understand the teaching-learning strategies and evaluation systems of the institution.
4. follow the time schedules, rules and regulations of the institution.
5. undertake regular and intense study of learning materials.
6. make optimum use of the learning resources and other support services available in the institution.
7. prepare for continuous internal assessment and term-end examinations.
8. give feedback for system improvement.
9. have faith and ability to pursue lifelong learning.
10. live as worthy alumni of the institution.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Students are responsible for their behaviour, both in and outside the College.

1. They are prohibited from visiting any other College without the written permission of the Principal of the college.
2. Every student must always be decently and neatly dressed, befitting the academic environment.
3. Smoking is strictly prohibited in and around the College premises.
4. Students must maintain strict silence in the classroom, Library, Reading Room, Laboratories and in the corridors where classrooms are located.
5. Students must not loiter in the corridors when classes are going on. When they are free, they should go to the Reading Room, Library or the students' common room.
6. Students must not attend any class other than their own without prior permission of the professor concerned.
7. Students must take proper care of college property, and help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Students must not write on the blackboard, nor disfigure walls, tables or benches. Any willful damage to the property of the college will be dealt with as a breach of discipline.
8. Student has to take the written permission of the Principal to start or join any outside organization.
9. No person shall be invited to address a college meeting or to occupy the chair at the college debate, meetings or functions without the previous permission of the Principal.
10. Students are not allowed to invite any outsider to the college or to the college canteen.
11. No student should, without the permission of the Principal, write to the Press or communicate any information to it about matters relating to college administration.

12. A student must not, directly or indirectly, do any act, which in the opinion of the Principal, is or may be detrimental to the working of the college or to the interest of the students or the maintenance of discipline.
13. If a student remains absent without leave for any length of time, his/her name is liable to be removed from the college rolls.
14. Failure to observe any of the above rules will call for disciplinary action against the student.

The College expects every student to abide by the following Code of Conduct:

1. Students must wear their Identity Card when they are in the college premises. Transfer of Identity Card is a criminal offence. The student will be liable to expulsion from the College.
2. Littering in the classrooms, corridors & the campus is prohibited. Please use the dustbins provided all around. Maintain plastic free campus. Offenders will be penalised.
3. Sitting on the vehicles in the college compound or on a road is strictly prohibited.

MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS
STATUTES AND ORDINANCES RELATED TO ADMISSION

FACULTY OF ARTS

1. Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-0.24001 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three year integrated course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects:

1. English
2. Any one of the Modern Indian Languages or Modern Foreign Languages or any Classical Language or Information Technology.
3. Any four subjects carrying 100 marks each.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination with vocational subject conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects:

1. English
2. Any one vocational subject carrying 200 marks prescribed by the Board from time to time.
3. Any three subjects carrying 100 marks each.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination with the Minimum Competency based vocational courses conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects:

1. English
2. Any one of the Modern Indian Languages or Modern Foreign Languages or Classical Language or Information Technology
3. General Foundation Course.
4. Any one subject carrying 300 marks from among the Minimum Competency based vocational courses prescribed by the Higher Secondary School Certificate examination from time to time.

OR

Must have passed an examination of another University or Body recognized as equivalent thereto.

2. Master of Arts (M.A) Programme

Ordinance No. PG-0.24001 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the course leading to the degree of Master of Arts must have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor of Arts (three year integrated course) of this University or the degree of Bachelor of Arts (Old that is four year course) of this University or a degree of another University recognized as equivalent thereto.

Provided, however, that applications of graduates of this University in the faculties other than the faculty of Arts, or those who have passed the equivalent examination of another recognized University seeking admission to the M.A. degree course by papers, will be considered by the Academic Council on the merits of each individual case on the recommendation of the Head of the University Department concerned/Chairman of the Board of Studies concerned in the subject in which there is no University Department/Principal of a college where the Post-Graduate Centre is granted, and in the case of a student seeking admission to the course by research, on the recommendation of the Chairmen of the Committee of recognized Teachers in the subject concerned before recommending such applications, the following procedure shall be followed:

A written test consisting of 2 papers as under shall be administered in the subject in which the student desires to register for his M.A. degree.

- (i) An essay paper in the subject,
- (ii) A paper to test the student's general acquaintance with the subject

The change of faculty test required to be given by the students has been waived in case of students who desire to register with the Directorate of Distance Education.

N.B.: Candidates shall be given a list of books for period reading before they are examined.

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three year integrated course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate examination (Std. XII) conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune, in the following subjects:

- (C) MCVC Streams Vocational Subjects: Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSC) (Std. XII) Examination Certificate (HSC) (Std. XII) examination with conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Pune, in the following subjects:

- 01 English (Higher or Lower Level) (100 marks)
- 02 Any one of the Modern Indian (100 marks) Languages OR Modern Foreign Languages OR any Classical Language (Higher or Lower Level) OR Information Technology.
- 03 General Foundation course (100 marks)
- 04 to 06 Any three of the minimum compete vocational subjects carrying total of 300 [from among the following groups prescribed for the HSC (Std. XII) examination namely Engineering & Technology Group Agriculture Group, Fisheries Group, Para Medical Group and Catering & Food Technology Group]

Further that the students, passing the HSC (Std.XII) examination with the MCVC stream shall be eligible for admission to F.Y.B.Sc. for certain subject combinations only depending on their subjects (04 to 06) of the MCVC stream as specified in the following table.:

(F) Must have passed at list the Second Year Examination of the Post S.S.C. (Std. X) Three Year Engineering Diploma course or the 4th Semester of 6th Semester Engineering Diploma Course conducted by approved by recognized by affiliated to the Maharashtra Board of Technical Education or another Body Board recognized as equivalent thereto.

Further, that such students of Engineering Diploma courses shall be eligible to offer any three of the following subjects for admission to the F.Y.B.Sc.

Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science, Information Technology, Geology, Geography, Economics.

2. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Computer Science) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-0.24003 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three years integrated course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) must have passed Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (Std. XII) in Science stream conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with Mathematics and Statistics as one of the subject or its equivalent.

Admission will be on merit, based on order of preference as follows:

1. Aggregate Marks at H.S.C. or equivalent.
2. Aggregate Marks in Science Group (Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics)
3. Marks in Mathematics and Statistics and Physics.
4. Marks in Mathematics and Statistics.

3. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Information Technology) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-0.24004 Dated 29" April 2024

Eligibility

(a) A candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course of Bachelor of Science-Information Technology, shall have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or it's equivalent with Mathematic and Statistics as one of the subject and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate for open category and 40% marks in aggregate in case of Reserved category candidates.

(b) Candidate who have passed Diploma (Three years after S.S.C. Xth Std.) in Information Technology/Computer Technology/Computer Engineering/Computer Science/ Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches/Mechanical and Allied Branches/Civil and Allied branches are eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course.

However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

OR

Candidates with post HSC-Diploma in Information Technology/ Computer Technology/ Computer Engineering/ Computer Science/ and Allied branches will be eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of B.Sc. (I.T.).

However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body Minimum Marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

4. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Bio-Technology) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-0.24005 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Three year Integrated course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) must have passed Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (Std.XII) in Science conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent in Science stream.

Admission will be on merit, based on order of preference as follows:

Aggregate Marks at H.S.C. or equivalent.

Aggregate Marks in Science Group (Physics, Chemistry and Biology).

Marks in Biology and Chemistry.

Marks in Biology.

A candidate who has not offered Mathematics and Statistics as one of the Subject at H.S.C. (Std.XII) shall have to satisfactorily complete a course on Mathematics and Statistics (of 15 hours duration) during the academic year of First year B.Sc. in which he is admitted.

5. Master of Science (M.Sc. Physics, M.Sc. Chemistry, M.Sc. Mathematics, M.Sc. Microbiology) Programme

Ordinance No. PG-O.24002 Dated 29 April 2024

Eligibility

Admissions will be made on merit (i.e. percentage of aggregate marks or grade secured at the qualifying examination). Reservation criteria shall be followed as prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra at the time of admission.

A learner for being eligible to apply for admission for the integrated ten semester M.Sc. Programme must have passed H.S.C. (10+02) or equivalent examination with minimum 50% marks for students belonging to the general category and 45% marks for learners belonging to the reserved category with science subjects as may be prescribed for a given course.

Biochemistry, Biophysics, Fisheries management, Life Sciences, Information Technology, Applied and Industrial Chemistry, Biotechnology, M.Sc. (Home Science), M.Sc. (Home Science) in Food Processing and Preservation, M.Sc. (Home Science) in Sports and Nutrition, Five year integrated M. Sc. course in Basic Sciences, Bioanalytical Sciences, Herbal Sciences, Bioanalytical instrumentation, Bioinformatics, Nanoscience and Nano Technology, Environmental Sciences, Nutraceuticals and Five Year Integrated Course in Bioanalytical Sciences must have passed.

The B.Sc. degree examination of this university or degree of any other university recognized as equivalent thereto with minimum 46 credits or its equivalent (i.e. the minimum credits required for majoring in a subject and excluding the credits for optional courses) of the subject which he wants to offer for the M.Sc. degree course by papers. The admission shall be strictly on merit for the seats allotted by the University. However, where the seats are allotted

by the college, the Head of the institution shall have discretionary powers for admission under "College seats" which shall not exceed 30% of the total allotted quota. Without prejudice the same shall be applicable unless prescribed by the University Rules or otherwise.

6. Master of Science (M.Sc. Biotechnology) Programme

Ordinance No. PG-O.24003 Dated 29 April 2024

Eligibility

A learner being eligible for admission to the M.Sc. degree course in Biotechnology must have passed.

The B.Sc. (Three Year integrated course) degree examination of this University or any Other University recognized as equivalent thereto) with the major subject Biotechnology, Life Science, Botany, Zoology, Microbiology, Applied or Allied Biological Science, Bioinformatics, Agriculture Sciences, Fisheries Science, Veterinary Sciences or any other Sciences with Biological Sciences as ancillary subject.

The learners will be admitted to the M.Sc. degree course in Biotechnology on the basis of the marks obtained at the T.Y.B.Sc. Examination.

7. Master of Science (M.Sc. Computer Science) Programme

Ordinance No. PG-O.24004 Dated 29 April 2024

Eligibility

A learner who has either passed Bachelor's Degree Examination of University of Mumbai in Science or equivalent degree of any other university recognized as equivalent thereto with one of the following as major subject:-

Major Mathematics OR

Major Physics Ancillary Mathematics OR

Major Statistics Ancillary Mathematics OR

The Bachelor of Engineering (B.E.) Degree Examination OR

The B.Sc. (Computer Science) / BCS / B.Sc. (Information Technology) / BCA Degree Examination

8. Master of Science (M.Sc. Data Science) Programme

Eligibility

Candidates must have a Bachelor's degree in Science or Arts or Commerce or Technology from University of Mumbai or an equivalent degree from a recognized university.

A minimum of 45% marks in graduation is required to be eligible for admission.

Candidates without Mathematics in 12th must complete a bridge course to be eligible for the programme.

(Till successful completion of a bridge course the admission will be considered to be Provisional)

FACULTY OF COMMERCE

1. Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-0.24006 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three year degree course leading to the Bachelor of Commerce must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination with vocational subjects/minimum competency based vocational course conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed an examination of another University or Body recognized as equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination.

2. Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting & Finance) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-0.24007 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

(a) A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting and Finance) degree course shall have passed XII std. Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent and secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate at first attempt (40% in case of reserved category).

(b) Every candidate admitted to the degree course in the constituent /affiliated college/recognized institution, conducting the course, shall have to register himself/herself with the University.

3. Bachelor of Commerce (Management Studies) Programme

Ordinance No. UG-O.24008 Dated 29th April 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the B.M.S. Degree Course shall have passed H.S.C. Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination or Diploma in any Engineering branches with two years or three years duration after S.S.C. conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or its equivalent examination by securing minimum 45% marks for general category (in one attempt) at the respective Examination and minimum 40% marks for the reserved category (in one attempt).

No college shall conduct any entrance test in any form and the admissions are purely based on merit duly following the reservation policy as per the norms of Government of Maharashtra. While drawing the merit list, weightage has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12th standard level. The stream wise weightage to be given is as under:

The applications are to be accepted and processed by the colleges stream wise separately and the merit list is to be displayed stream wise taking into account the reservation policy prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra.

- a. The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.
- b. In case if no applications are received under the "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" or if the seats remain vacant in "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" after all the merit lists/forms are exhausted, the vacant seats must be transferred to Commerce Stream.
- c. In case if no application is received from any stream the vacant seats are to be distributed equally between the remaining two streams only.
- d. After the first merit list is displayed, if any seat allotted to one stream remains vacant, the same shall be distributed equally between the remaining two streams. In case of vacancy in one stream is of single/odd number of seats, the single seat is to be allotted to the Commerce Stream. In case if no applications are available from the two streams, then all the vacant seats of such two streams must be transferred to the third stream,
- e. Step (d) be repeated for the subsequent merit lists till all the forms are exhausted or the final merit list is displayed, whichever is earlier

4. Bachelor of Performing Arts (BPA)

Ordinance No. UG-O.24009 Dated 5th July 2024

Eligibility

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three / four years degree course leading to the Bachelor of Performing Arts must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education from any stream.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination with vocational subjects/minimum competency based vocational course conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed an examination of another University or Body recognized as equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination.

5. Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)

Ordinance No. UG-O.24010 Dated 5th July 2024

Eligibility

Clause I: Eligibility Requirements (As per AICTE)

Passed 10+2 Examination: Candidates must have completed their higher secondary education (10+2) from a recognized board.

University Eligibility: Applicants must meet the specific eligibility criteria set by the Affiliating University.

Clause II: Entrance Test Requirement

The Government of Maharashtra has established the State Common Entrance Test Cell (CET CELL) under the Admission Regulating Authority (ARA) as per the provisions of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015.

The Commissioner, State CET Cell, will conduct the Entrance Test for the First Year of the Three/Four Year Full-Time Undergraduate Degree Course in Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA).

Additional Admission Procedure:

Candidates must fulfill the eligibility requirements stated in Clause I as per the AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2024-2027 and the Government of Maharashtra guidelines. Additionally, candidates should have appeared for and cleared the BBA CET Exam as per Clause II and participated in the subsequent Centralized Admission Process (CAP) rounds for admission.

6. Master of Commerce (M.Com) Programme

Ordinance No. PG-O.24005 Dated 29 April 2024

Eligibility

A learner for being eligible for admission to the Post Graduate Programme i.e. Master of Commerce, shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor of Commerce (three years/Six Semester integrated course) or the degree B.Com. (Old Course) or the other Semester based Programmes i.e. Bachelor of Commerce (Banking & Insurance) or Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting & Finance) or Bachelor of Commerce (Financial Markets) or Bachelor of Management Studies (B.M.S.) of this University, or an examination of any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

7. Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.) Programme

Eligibility

Candidates must have Passed minimum Three-year Duration Bachelor's Degree awarded by any of the Universities or institution recognised by University Grants Commission or Association of Indian Universities in any discipline with at least 50% marks in aggregate or equivalent (45% in case of candidates domiciled in Maharashtra and belonging to the Reserved Categories such as SC, ST, VJ/DT-NT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), OBC, SBC, SEBC, EWS, PWD)

Candidates must have appeared for an entrance examination like MAH-CET (MMS/MBA), or other exams like CAT, CMAT, ATMA, or MAT as per the Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) guidelines.

Students in their final year of their bachelor's degree can also apply, provided they meet the eligibility criteria based on their performance up to that point and complete their final examinations and viva voce by the time of joining the MBA program.

The score you achieve in the entrance exam will be a major factor in your application evaluation.

ATTENDANCE, RENEWAL & CLEARANCE FORM

ATTENDANCE: According to the University norms, students who wish to perceive the admission in the college have to attend regularly the scheduled lectures, tutorials, and practical and semester wise examinations. College maintains lecture wise attendance of every student. A student having attendance less than 75% per Course in a month is remarked as irregular student. If anyone is continuously irregular in number of Courses then parents of such students are informed about his/her irregularity and punishable action is taken. If no progress is observed in the overall behaviour of the student, then as per university norms severe actions will be taken against the student. Student should keep serious concern about his/her attendance.

As per 0.6086 in respect of **Attendance for learners** Every bonafide learner shall ordinarily be allowed to keep terms for the given semester in a program of his enrolment, only if he fulfils at least seventy five percent (75%) of the attendance taken as an average of the total number of lectures, practicals, tutorials etc. wherein short and/or long excursions/field visits/study tours organized by the college and supervised by the teachers as envisaged in the syllabus shall be credited to his attendance for the total no of periods which are otherwise delivered on the material day/s. Further it is mandatory for every learner to have min 50% attendance for each course & average attendance has to be 75%.

Students should duly inform the concerned Vice Principal about their absence or irregularity with appropriate reasons. Parents are requested to meet the concerned Vice Principal at least once in a Semester to discuss about attendance and overall academics of the ward.

RENEWAL OF ADMISSION: It is essential to renew the admission for Semester II, Semester IV and Semester VI as per the schedule declared by college time to time. Fees Refund Policy

4. Sports:

The college has a history of glorious achievements of students in sports at University, State, National and International levels. SHODHVEDH committee is monitoring all student research activities of the college. SHODHVEDH research competition is initiated in each department by innovative ideas of either students or teachers. The college provides financial backbone to each research project. We conduct research orientation workshop for these students each year in the month of July / August. The Principal addresses the students regarding research activity. Speakers for this workshop are renowned people who are engaged in research. After listening such motivational and thoughtful process of research, students are oriented for targeted research.

Every department identifies potential students having aptitude in carrying out research activity. Each department then gives projects and the mentoring teachers to students. The department encourages the students for research by providing journals, reference books and even external researcher for additional required help. In each academic year, students work on 60-70 research projects from our college.

After 2 months duration, SHODHVEDH competition notice is issued to the students. Softcopy of the research abstract is submitted to SHODHVEDH committee of different places for Arts, Commerce and Science faculties in the college. Expert persons are invited by the college to judge the research done. Generally, students prepare poster (1meter x 1meter size) of their research work. The Judges select prominent research projects from each faculty. After SHODHVEDH research competition, the selected projects are presented and felicitated on National Science Day.

More work is done for each selected project and thus projects are refined. In the meantime, University of Mumbai announces Inter-University research competition-AVISHKAR. Keeping in view the new challenges, His Excellency, the Governor of Maharashtra and the Chancellor of the Universities in the State of Maharashtra, Honorable Shri. S. M. Krishna had initiated AVISHKAR Research Convention in the academic year 2007-2008. Its objective are as follows:

- To inculcate research culture among students.
- To encourage original and novel thinking.
- To provide an opportunity for expression of academic talent.
- To promote interaction among academia, R & D institutes and industries.

Added more work in each research project increases the probability of sustaining in different rounds of AVISHKAR. The college takes responsibility of all the expenditures for selected research students in different rounds of AVISHKAR research competition. The potential projects from SHODHVEDH are sent to zonal level round of AVISHKAR. From this round, few projects are selected for University level round of AVISHKAR. From this round, few projects are screened for state level round of AVISHKAR. Such ecosystem is also utilized for the incubation of many useful activities in the college. The achievements of college in Avishkar Competition are remarkable. The Students of our college has bagged gold medals and silver medals many times in this competition.
